Learn ways to paint and draw the trees outside, landscapes, flowers and birds. Materials are provided but feel free to bring any rocks, twigs, feathers, shells or other natural items as well.

Painting Studio 320

Have fun learning basic and more adventurous techniques with acrylic, watercolors and ink. Spray, brush, drip or swat color on with a variety of brushes and tools. Self expression is encouraged!

Scene Study 330

Learn how to perform with others on stage while fine-tuning your performance.

Scribbling, Splatting, Spackling Studio 203

Let's scribble and splatter outside the borders. Students will experiment with painting, sculpture and drawing media. This is a great class for self-expression.

Sculpture Fun 210

Tie-Dye 101 221

Learn the basics of making Exceptional Tie Dye. Students need to bring a 100% cotton t-shirt the first day. Students will have the opportunity to tie-dye several pieces of clothing.

Tie-Dye 332

Learn the basics of how to tie-dye your own clothing and other fabrics. Please bring a 100% cotton t-shirt the first day.

Tile Mosaics 312

The students will use tiny mosaics in designing unique projects. The class will also explore ancient designs for inspiration. Stepping stones may also be explored in this class.

Traditional Japanese Art 252

Students will explore traditional forms of art that have been around for hundreds of years. The class will get inspiration from woodblock printing, ink painting, origami and making clay tea bowls. The class will also sculpt Joman period clay figures of men and horses.
